Cave Quest Comes to Beechy!

This past summer, we had the opportunity to transform our church sanctuary into a Cave Quest complete with stalagmites, stalactites

and cave dwelling creatures. We used a curriculum from Group as the base for our Vacation Bible School (VBS) week and adapted activities, decorations and crafts to best fit the resources, volunteers and kids we anticipated. We had 40-50 cavers join us each day. The spelunkers were divided into small groups of 5-8 kids per leader and, aside from the group that



consisted solely of preschoolers, each group had boys and girls of various ages. In



our small groups, we explored attributes of the cave creatures that revealed truths about God and our need for Him. We were able to build relationships with the kids in their small groups, and share the Gospel with them as we played, created and sang with them throughout the week. We all

greatly enjoyed the music that accompanied the curriculum. There were some great new songs and some oldies, with an upbeat twist.

Some new opportunities we had this year:

- □ We were privileged to be able to welcome a bus load of kids from a nearby town which did not have any VBS program. A family from our church, also living in that community, spearheaded the initiative to find a bus for 10-12 kids, in addition to their own, and took on the responsibility of getting the kids to and from VBS each day. It was no small task!
- ☐ Many kids, who did not have a Bible of their own, really wanted one. We were not prepared with enough Bibles. What a great problem to have! Fortunately, we were supplied with Bibles shortly after VBS ended; it gave us an opportunity to have a post VBS BBQ with those children along with many of their families.

The support from our church family was immense in volunteer time, prayer and donations. We are so grateful for God's protection, provision and His moving in the lives of the kids and the volunteers.

- ✓ Pray for churches, camps and their staff daily.
- ✓ Respond to phone calls, emails and written correspondence within twenty-four hours.
- ✓ Actively listen to your inquiries or concerns.
- ✓ Ensure that Conference resources are offered and explained.
- ✓ Devote the time needed to ensure you have the support required for your ministry.
- ✓ Follow-up on your initial inquiry or concern within a week asking if you need further help.
- ✓ Personally visit your church or camp at least once a year.
- ✓ Obtain ministry updates from your camp or church once every two months.
- ✓ Provide timely and relevant updates from the provincial and Canadian MB offices.
- Once a year ask you how we did in meeting these ministry targets.

SKMB Teams Huddle '16

Last Saturday, the SKMB Teams gathered at the MCC Centre in Saskatoon for their annual Teams Huddle.

Team meeting highlights:

Faith & Life Team: adopted a new national Ministry Questionnaire for incoming pastors to SKMB ministry; adopted a new national Ordination 'manual'.



Church Multiplication: a new Church Multiplication Team replaces the former C2C-SK Regional Leadership Team and a separate C2C Team will be formed and work in partnership with the Church Multiplication Team. Ministry Support Team: approved the 2017 Recommended Salary Grid for SKMB pastoral staff; started on the 2017 Budget proposal; recommended that there be a review of the Conference and churches' insurance coverages to ensure that there aren't any potential unnecessary exposures. Developmental Leadership Team: continued with the development of a

discipleship template for distribution at the 2017 Convention; continues to work with the Bethany visioning group in young adult discipleship.

Director of Ministry Phil Gunther addressed the Teams, sharing a ministry update, and speaking to how the SKMB office was doing in accomplishing its ministry service targets. Phil also spoke to the diversity and unity within the SKMB. He noted that what unifies the SKMB is Jesus, Scripture, the Gospel, a desire for outreach, the work of the Holy Spirit and the central place of discipleship.
