2023 Leadership Conference



My experience at the leadership conference in Saskatoon this last month was an enjoyable one. Aside from the meeting of new people and seeing a few familiar faces from my Bible college grad class, there was the teaching from Darryl Dash, a pastor from the Toronto

area, which was based on Paul's advice to Timothy in 2 Timothy.

Friday evening saw Darryl teach on the topic of resting in the sufficiency of Christ in our leadership roles in the hopes of allowing us to sleep well that night. He stressed the fact that while we were to do the work, ultimately any results in our ministry were in the hands of an almighty and all-knowing God who cares for us and that should be a great comfort to us. This was extremely encouraging to me as someone who is new to the ministry.

In Saturday morning's first session Darryl taught on the necessity of having proper motivation for ministry. He asserted that having the proper motivation helps a leader push through the difficult times because it is hard to go the distance without having the big picture in mind. He taught that remembering our salvation and the gospel were key to being able to carry on through the difficulties of life, especially those that come with ministry and leadership. This is a timeless reminder. One that is always pertinent to any situation because we can so easily lose sight of the gospel in our own lives. As one of my professors loved to say, "We need to preach the Gospel to ourselves everyday."

The second session on Saturday morning brought the teaching that there were three aspects of ministry that we needed to pay close attention to. The first was the type of teaching, second was personal character, and third was relationship. He emphasised that reminding people is a valuable component of preaching and teaching and that we have a duty to warn people of distraction. We need to have a blameless character, one that is above reproach, if those who hear us are to take our words seriously. He stressed "blameless not sinless" which I think is a

proper biblical view considering many of the patriarchs were considered blameless, but definitely not sinless. He also pointed out that we need to love others well, showing grace and mercy when needed.

Overall, I was greatly built up and challenged by Darryl's teaching and the rest of the forum as well. I look forward to attending more in the future.
