Noah Fehr (West Portal, Saskatoon)

Noah is currently entering his 3rd year of a Bachelor of Arts in Christian Studies (Bible-Theology focus) at Steinbach Bible College. Studying at Steinbach for Noah has meant growing through both classes and community. He’s excited to continue growing in his knowledge of the Bible and how to communicate through preaching. This coming year, he will also be serving as a head care group leader in the men’s dormitory—the challenge being to live out his faith as he disciples others. When asked about a key learning during his time at Steinbach, Noah points to how God’s been teaching him the value of rest. “I don’t implement it perfectly, but there’s value in not only taking time away from work/study to rest, but also using that time to intentionally invest in others.” Following graduation, Noah hopes to return to Saskatoon to pursue an electrician apprenticeship “as someone who follows Christ in their life.”

Marley Berge (Forest Grove, Saskatoon)

Marley says that doing a Masters in Counselling first came on her radar after working with refugees overseas and in Canada, and noticing the lack of mental health services for refugees/newcomers and for those working alongside them. Her appreciation grew as she began to see a counsellor herself. “Counselling became a place where I met God in ways I hadn’t experienced him before.” As she enters the final year of her program and prepares to work in the counselling field, Marley knows that it’s her own growing as a disciple of Jesus that enables her to

walk with others. When asked what she loves most about counselling, she says it’s nothing more than hearing people’s stories. “It is a true privilege to have people trust me with their hopes, hurts, confusion, dreams, and disappointments. I feel really honoured that I get to know people in this way and journey with them towards healing. It’s amazing what you learn when your job is to listen.”
